## Success Story: Douglas Robertson

Douglas Robertson contacted the Coalition when he had

nowhere else to go. He had a drug addiction and was homeless. He wanted to change but needed help. Once he got acquainted with the program at Blair Shelter, we helped him enroll in a Home Health Aide program sponsored by the Department of Human Services. It took several months, but Mr. Robertson found his footing. He graduated and received a certificate of completion.

Mr. Robertson is still going strong and works full-time as a home health aide. The Coalition for the Homeless also hired him as a Resident Manager at Sherman Avenue Single Room Occupancy. When Mr. Robertson came to our program, his life had fallen apart. Mr. Robertson is now thriving and independent. When asked what advice he would give to others struggling, he replied, "Ask for help and stay focused."
